# What Kind of Library Card Do I Need?

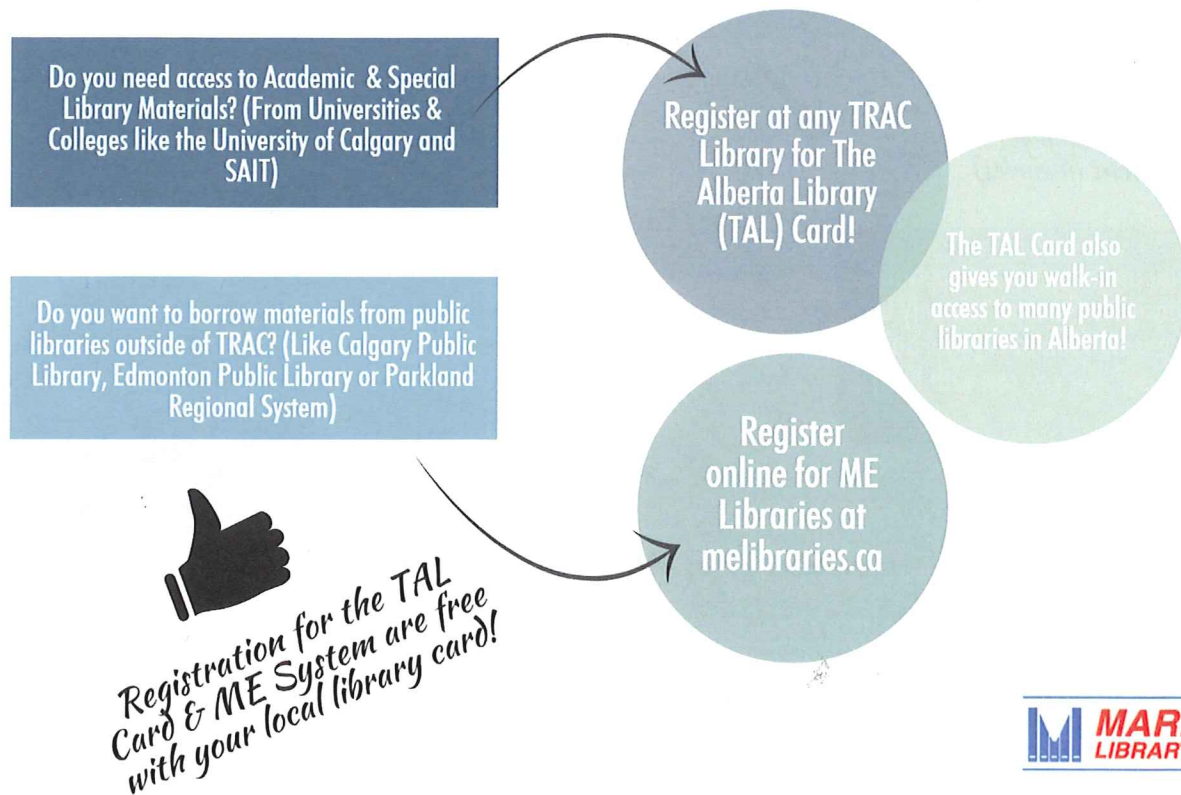
Use this chart to help you determine what kind of library services you should sign up for.

## Step 1:

Visit your local library to become a member and get your TRAC Card. Your TRAC Card gives you access to over 3 million items across public libraries in Alberta!

## Step 2:

Once you're a member of TRAC, you can choose to sign up for ME Libraries and/or The Alberta Library (TAL) Card to expand your access to information even further!



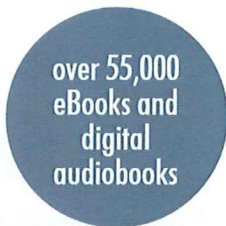
# What do you get with each service?

## TRAC Card

Your local library card (TRAC card) gives you instant access to over 170 public libraries across Alberta. Search [tracpac.ab.ca](http://tracpac.ab.ca) to place requests and have materials sent to the TRAC Library closest to you.

Registering for the TAL Card & ME Libraries expands your borrowing possibilities even further!

*Academic & Special Library Items  
(Universities, Colleges & Government libraries)*

With TAL you can borrow from special & academic libraries. Services can only be accessed in person (you can't place holds with a TAL card like you can with ME!)

With ME, your TRAC Card can be used at most public libraries across Alberta. You can place holds to be picked up at all ME locations except Calgary Public Library.
